This discussion aimed to create a comprehensive roadmap for sustainable tourism in Goa's hinterlands, ensuring that tourism contributes positively to the environment, economy, and local communities.

11. Description of the Program/activity/event

The First Edition of Policy Manthan 2025, held as part of the 2nd Edition of the Parrikar National Moot Court & Policy Hackathon 2025, took place on 28th February 2025, from 10:00 AM to 1:30 PM, at the Biotechnology Seminar Hall, Block E, Goa University. The event began with a warm welcome extended by the organizers to the esteemed panelists and the moderator, setting the stage for a series of insightful discussions.

The formal inaugural ceremony of the First Edition of Policy Manthan was conducted between 12:00 PM and 12:35 PM. The ceremony was graced by **Shri. Sadanand Shet Tanavade**, Honorable Member of Parliament, Rajya Sabha, as the Chief Guest, and **Shri. Bhushan Savaikar**, Director of the Directorate of Higher Education, as the Guest of Honour. Prominent dignitaries, including **Prof. Sunder Dhuri**, Registrar of Goa University, **Sr. Prof. Rajendra Gad**, Dean of the Manohar Parrikar School of Law, Governance and Public Policy, and **Prof. Purva Hegde**, Dean of Goa Business School, were also present on the occasion.

During the inaugural session, the invited dignitaries delivered addresses that emphasized the significance of sustainable policy-making and collective effort. A highlight of the ceremony was the unveiling of the first published copy of the '**NITIPRASHASAK**' Newsletter, an initiative of the Public Administration Program. The session was seamlessly compared by **Dr. Steffi Quintal**, Program Director and Assistant Professor of the Public Administration Program, while **Dr. Sara Mahima George**, Assistant Professor of Public Administration, concluded the ceremony with a heartfelt vote of thanks.

This momentous event brought together academia and policymakers, marking a significant step forward in fostering meaningful discussions on policy development and innovation.

The highlights of the panel discussion are as follows:

1. **Dr. Rajiv Kumar Chaturvedi** (BITS Pilani, Goa Campus) highlighted the ecological sensitivity of the Western Ghats, cautioning against the potential risks of landslides and rising temperatures, urging that Goa should avoid becoming another Wayanad.

2. **Parag Rangnekar** (Ecologist, Mrugaya Xpeditions) emphasized that hinterland tourism should prioritize capacity building and local governance over financial gains. He advocated for a phased approach with strict 'NO GO' zones to protect endangered species and maintain the integrity of local communities.
3. **Mr. Sanjeev Sardesai** (CEO, HANDS on HISTORIANS) warned against the commercialization of hinterland tourism, exposing the land to external land mafias. He stressed the need to rectify the current tourism policy in alignment with the land's carrying capacity to preserve Goa's cultural heritage.
4. **Ranjita Pai** (Chairperson, Goa State Commission for Women) underscored the negative impact of existing tourism policies on women and called for women's inclusion in designing and implementing hinterland tourism policies to ensure empowerment and safety.
5. **Sanjay Amonkar** (Director General, Goa Chamber of Commerce & Industries) pointed out the failure to position Goa among the top tourist destinations by 2030, emphasizing that local villagers should benefit from hinterland tourism rather than private players, to bolster local institutions.

Key Themes and Takeaways:

- The discussion revealed a consensus on the need for a sustainable, inclusive, and well-planned hinterland tourism policy that protects the environment and benefits local communities.
- There was a strong emphasis on involving local stakeholders and ensuring women's participation in the tourism policy framework.
- The potential threats to the environment and local culture were highlighted, necessitating a careful and considerate approach to tourism development.

Q&A Session Highlights:

The audience, including students and participants from various regions, raised pertinent questions on financial benefits, land-grabbing, corruption, local stakeholders' involvement, and the potential ecological impact of hinterland tourism. The

	concerns reflected a shared apprehension about preserving Goa's natural and cultural heritage while fostering sustainable development. The panel concluded with a call for more robust and action-oriented discussions like Policy Manthan, aiming to craft a hinterland tourism policy that is equitable, sustainable, and respectful of Goa's unique ecological and cultural landscape.
12. Benefit/Key outcomes of the Program/activity/event	The panel discussion on the Sustainable Hinterland Tourism Policy of Goa yielded several benefits and outcomes, such as: 1. Enhanced Awareness: ○ Increased stakeholder understanding about the importance of sustainable tourism in Goa's hinterlands. ○ Greater awareness of tourism's environmental, cultural, and economic impacts. 2. Policy Recommendations: ○ Development of actionable strategies and policies to promote sustainable tourism. ○ Identification of challenges and opportunities specific to hinterland tourism in Goa. 3. Community Empowerment: ○ Encouragement of local community participation in tourism planning and decision-making. ○ Empowerment of locals through training and resources to benefit economically from tourism. 4. Environmental Conservation: ○ Promotion of eco-friendly tourism practices to preserve Goa's natural beauty and biodiversity. ○ Initiatives to mitigate the environmental impact of tourism activities. 5. Economic Growth: ○ Boosting the local economy through sustainable tourism initiatives.

	○ Creation of job opportunities and support for local businesses and artisans. 6. Cultural Preservation: ○ Protection and promotion of Goa's rich cultural and historical heritage. ○ Integration of local traditions and crafts into the tourism experience. 7. Collaborative Efforts: ○ Strengthened collaboration between government bodies, NGOs, private stakeholders, and local communities. ○ Establishment of partnerships to implement sustainable tourism practices effectively. 8. Tourism Innovation: ○ Introduction of innovative tourism models, such as community-based and regenerative tourism. ○ Exploration of new tourism opportunities that align with sustainability goals. These outcomes aim to create a balanced approach to tourism that benefits the environment, economy, and local communities while preserving Goa's unique identity.

Report on First Edition of Policy Manthan 2025

Sustainable Hinterland Tourism Policy of Goa

The First Edition of Policy Manthan 2025, an integral part of the **2nd Edition of Parrikar National Moot Court & Policy Hackathon 2025**, took place on **28th February 2025** at the **Biotechnology Seminar Hall, Block E, Goa University**. The event, held from **10:00 AM to 1:30 PM**, was a platform that brought together policymakers, scholars, and industry leaders to engage in critical discussions about sustainable hinterland tourism policy for Goa. The day began with the organizers welcoming the esteemed panelists and the moderator, setting the tone for an insightful session that explored various dimensions of sustainable tourism.

The formal inauguration of the First Edition of Policy Manthan commenced at **noon** and concluded at **12:35 PM**. The session was graced by the presence of **Shri. Sadanand Shet Tanavade**, Honorable Member of Parliament, Rajya Sabha, who was the chief guest for the occasion. **Shri. Bhushan Savaikar**, Director of the Directorate of Higher Education, attended as the guest of honor. Other prominent dignitaries included **Prof. Sunder Dhuri**, Registrar of Goa University, **Sr. Prof. Rajendra Gad**, Dean of the Manohar Parrikar School of Law, Governance and Public Policy, and **Prof. Purva Hegde**, Dean of Goa Business School. During the inauguration, the dignitaries shared their insights and emphasized the importance of formulating sustainable policies for the future. A highlight of the session was the unveiling of the first published copy of the '**NITIPRASHASAK**' Newsletter, a significant milestone for the Public Administration Program. The session was skillfully compared by **Dr. Steffi Quintal**, Program Director and Assistant Professor of the Public Administration Program, while **Dr. Sara Mahima George**, Assistant Professor of Public Administration, delivered a heartfelt vote of thanks. Assistant Professor Ms. Sanskruti Ayir coordinated the First edition of Policy Manthan. A total number of 91 participants registered and attended the event.

The panel discussion, which followed, focused on key aspects of sustainable hinterland tourism policy. **Dr. Rajiv Kumar Chaturvedi** from BITS Pilani, Goa Campus, underscored the ecological sensitivity of the Western Ghats and warned against the risks of landslides and rising temperatures. He stressed that Goa must avoid replicating the environmental challenges faced by Wayanad. **Parag Rangnekar**, an ecologist from Mrugaya Xpeditions, emphasized the need to prioritize capacity building and local governance in hinterland tourism. He proposed a phased approach with clearly defined "NO GO" zones to protect endangered species and maintain community integrity.

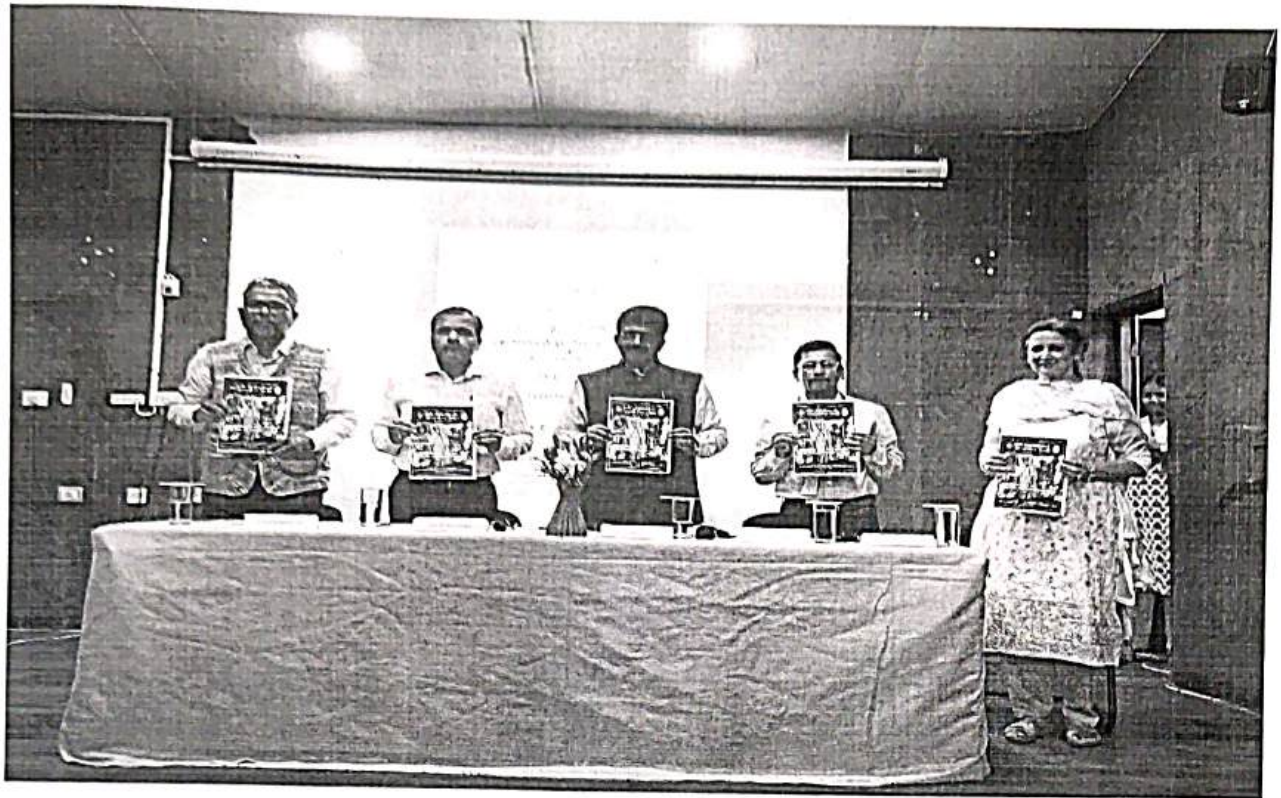
Furthering the discourse, **Mr. Sanjeev Sardesai**, CEO of HANDS on HISTORIANS, cautioned against the dangers of over-commercializing hinterland tourism, which could expose the region to

external land mafias. He called for a recalibration of tourism policies to align with the land's carrying capacity, ensuring that Goa's cultural heritage is preserved. **Ranjita Pai**, Chairperson of the Goa State Commission for Women, highlighted the adverse impacts of current tourism policies on women and advocated for their active inclusion in policy design and implementation to ensure empowerment and safety. **Sanjay Amonkar**, Director General of the Goa Chamber of Commerce & Industries, criticized the state's failure to position Goa among the top tourist destinations by 2030 and stressed the importance of ensuring that local villagers benefit from hinterland tourism, rather than private players. He argued that empowering local institutions should be a priority.

The discussion revealed a shared consensus on the importance of a sustainable, inclusive, and carefully planned tourism policy that safeguards the environment and benefits local communities. There was strong advocacy for involving local stakeholders in policy formulation and ensuring women's voice in the tourism framework. The ecological and cultural threats posed by unsustainable tourism were repeatedly highlighted, emphasizing the need for a thoughtful and considerate approach to development.

An engaging Q&A session followed, during which the audience, composed of students and participants from diverse regions, raised pertinent questions about financial benefits, land-grabbing, corruption, local stakeholders' involvement, and hinterland tourism's ecological impact. These questions reflected a collective concern for preserving Goa's natural and cultural heritage while fostering sustainable economic development.

The event concluded with a call for more robust and action-oriented discussions like Policy Manthan, which aims to shape equitable, sustainable, and respectful tourism policies for Goa's hinterlands. The discussion outcomes included heightened awareness among stakeholders regarding sustainable tourism, actionable policy recommendations, and strengthened collaboration between government bodies, NGOs, private stakeholders, and local communities. Empowerment of local stakeholders, especially women, was emphasized as a key goal, along with eco-friendly initiatives to conserve the environment and promote economic growth. Policy Manthan 2025 marked a significant step forward in fostering dialogue and action toward a balanced and inclusive approach to tourism in Goa.
