Description of the Program/activity/event           | <p>The Two-days National Conference on the theme <b><i>"75 Years of Indian Constitution: Reflections, Reforms and Road Ahead"</i></b> was held on 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> October 2025 in the Chemistry and Bio-tech auditoriums of Goa University. The theme of the Conference articulates the enduring relevance of the Constitution as a dynamic framework guiding India's democracy. The broad themes of the Conference included:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Constitutional Evolution</li> <li>• Federalism and Governance</li> <li>• Justice and Judicial Reform</li> <li>• Rights and Duties</li> <li>• Dissent and Democracy</li> <li>• Elections and Electoral Reforms</li> <li>• Constitution and Technology</li> <li>• Judiciary and Technology</li> <li>• Sustainable Development Goals and Constitution</li> </ul> <p>The inaugural session Vice Chancellor Prof. Harilal B. Menon, Registrar Dr. Sundhar Dhuri, Shri Bhushan Savaikar, Director, Directorate of Higher Education, Goa, Sr. Prof. Rajendra S. Gad, Dean, MPSLGPP, and Dr. Alaknanda Shringare, Vice Dean, Research, MPSLGPP and Coordinator of the National Conference Sr. Prof. Rajendra S. Gad delivered the welcome address, emphasizing the Constitution as a "living document" that upholds the rule of law, separation of powers, democracy, and fundamental rights. The dignitaries then lit the traditional lamp and released the compilation of abstracts. In his address, Shri Bhushan Savaikar reflected on India's economic progress, stressing the continued importance of equality and justice. He urged for broader inclusion of rights such as clean air, quality education, and healthcare under Article 21. Vice Chancellor Prof. (HAG) Harilal B. Menon described the Indian Constitution as a resilient framework, symbolically referring to it as a "tree" with the legal system as its branches. He highlighted its global relevance through the principle of Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam and encouraged the legal fraternity and youth to uphold</p> |

constitutional values and engage in critical reflection. Prof. Sundhar Dhuri proposed the vote of thanks, expressing gratitude to the dignitaries, Directorate of Higher Education, and the organizing team. The session concluded with a group photograph and the National Anthem.

The Seminar witnessed Panel Discussions and paper presentations on the broad themes and sub-themes from Faculty, Research Scholars and Graduate and Post-Graduate Students.

The first Panel Discussion was on titled *75 Years of Federalism in India*. Prof.V.N.Alok , the Moderator touched upon the historical background of the Constitution of India. He stated that India is a union of states, and not a federation of states. However, we have federalism since basic features of constitution cannot be changed. He also stated that we have multi order system because panchayat and municipalities are incorporated in the Constitution.

The first panelist, Prof.Sandeep Shastri spoke on the relevance of the Constitution in the 21st century and its needs, aspirations, and the importance of protecting the core of democracy. Prof. Shastri emphasised that the Constitution protects the "shell of democracy". He highlighted the "three Cs" essential for a healthy federal system: competition, competence, and coordination. He explained that competition among states and politics encourages innovation and progress, competence ensures capable governance, and coordination between the Centre and the States maintains balance and unity within the diversity.

The second Panelist Prof. Gopal Guru focused on the words "We the People" in the Preamble of the Constitution, explaining that these words represent the essence of India's republican character. Prof. Guru stressed that India's democracy must remain a government of the people, not of the elites. He underlined that the idea of "we" is inclusive and participatory, urging that governance should always reflect the collective will rather than the a few.

The third Panelist, Prof. Rekha Saxena, spoke on the evolution of federalism in India. She stated that "all constitutions are in a process of being and becoming," meaning that they continuously evolve with changing times and contexts and that the Indian constitution has evolved over the years. She also referred to various aspects of Indian federalism, including institutional and policy changes after 2014, such as the replacement of the Planning Commission by NITI Aayog.

Technical Session I was titled *Indian Constitution: Reflections and Reforms*. This Session was chaired by Prof. S.S. Patagundi. The paper presentation featured seven insightful papers examining various dimensions of the Indian Constitution.

**1.The Indian Constitution and Cultural Freedom**  
Dr. Malavika Menon, Faculty, Christ (Deemed to be University), Bangalore emphasized the phrase "*We the People*". Her presentation centered on Articles 26, 29, and 30, exploring the *Doctrine of Essential Practices* and the concept of *Secularism* as both an Indian and Western construct.

**2.The Indian Constitution: A Critical Appraisal of its Past, Present, and Future**

Mr. Ajit Mokal, Faculty, University of Mumbai analyzed the Constitution's success in sustaining a democratic, secular, and federal polity. He discussed the amendment process under Article 368 and the role of judicial review, while critiquing identity-based politics and contemporary constitutional challenges.

### **3. Harnessing Technology for Enhancing Registrations, Turnout, and Voter Confidence in Indian Elections**

Prof. Ganga Nath Jha, Faculty, DES Pune University highlighted the role of technology in improving electoral efficiency. He discussed automated detection of duplicate entries, e-voting practices in Estonia, the concept of *single-window clearance*, and strategies to increase youth participation in elections.

### **4. Constitutional Identity and the Preamble: Unity, Plurality, and Normative Claims**

Dr. Ambuj Sharma, Faculty, Post Graduate Government College for Girls, Chandigarh examined how Constitutional identity is framed through the Preamble, referencing B.R. Ambedkar and Jyotiba Phule to underline the Constitution's commitment to unity amid diversity.

### **5. Voters' Awareness and Perception of Political Consultants**

Mr. Challa Varshitha, Research Scholar, Bangalore University explored the role and origin of political consultants, tracing their global development and emergence in India. The paper investigated voter awareness and the factors driving the growth of political consultancy in the Indian context.

### **6. Fiscal Federalism and Governance in the Post-GST Era in India: Issues and Challenges**

Dr. Bharati Garg, Faculty, Panjab University enunciated key challenges in fiscal federalism after the introduction of GST, focusing on Centre-State financial relations and the influence of constitutional principles like the Preamble on fiscal governance.

### **7. Resource Federalism and Its Impact on Policy Implementation in the Mining Sector**

Ms. Minu Agrawal presented an in-depth analysis of mineral policies and legislations since 2015, identifying the gaps between policy formulation and implementation in India's mining sector.

Technical Session 2 was titled *Democracy, Dissent and Electoral Reforms*. It was chaired by Prof S.T. Bagalkoti. The session comprised of 4 paper presentations.

**1. Humour in Political Discourse: a Constitutional Perspective on Satire and Caricature.** Ms. Bino Bala B and Ms. Brindha S, Students, School of Excellence in Law, Tamil Nadu Dr. Ambedkar Law University examined the balance between freedom of speech and reasonable restrictions. They referenced key cases such as *Thomas vs. Malayala Manorama* and cultural examples like *Kissa Kursi Ka* and the *AIB Roast*.

**2. Assessing the Independence of the Election Commission of India: Challenges and Reforms.** Ms. Anandi Nain followed presented a study on

transparency in the Election Commission, addressing concerns such as fake voter identities and the exclusion of Aadhaar cards from the electoral process.

**3. Political Dissent in a Democracy:** India's Declining Position and Constitutional Challenges. Mr. Jonas Aaron Rodrigues presented on the declining space for dissent in India, highlighting the importance of protecting Article 19 rights and analyzing issues like media bias and the suppression of protests.

**4. The Constitution of India and the Constitution of Developed Countries.** Adv. Himani Dhingra presented a *comparative study of the Indian Constitution* and those of developed countries, emphasizing their mutual influences and differences.

In his closing remarks, Prof. Bagalkoti reflected on the challenges confronting true democracy, including money power and political criminalization, and urged participants to engage in small yet active efforts to safeguard democratic values.

The second Panel Discussion was titled **Constitutional Futures in a Globalized World of Law and Justice**. The panel was chaired by Dr. Sandhya Ram. The panel explored the intersection of national constitutional law with the pervasive effects of globalization, focusing on concepts of law, justice, and constitutional ideas across different jurisdictions. The discussion was structured around the contributions of the four panelists.

1. Prof. (Dr.) Jasmeet Gulati's focus was directed towards Constitutional law and global law as they relate to the protection of the homestead and issues of climate change., the integration of international law and the World Constitution into constitutional discourse.

2. Prof. (Dr.) Sairam Bhat's discussion emphasized on The Rule of Law and its dimensions in a changing world, The importance of the Constitution as a living document, the relationship between the Rule of Law and the concepts of Race and Religion. and Issues of Immigration.

3. Dr. Vasco Becker-Weinberg's Focus was on Indian Constitution and Portuguese, The concept of a Constitution as an idea and its immigration/transfer across countries, the roles of Judicial Review and Constitutional Law in shaping legal futures and Human Rights as a core constitutional and global concern. Overall

4. Dr. Ajay Gulati's contribution centered on the meaning of Globalization, defining it as a movement across cultures, a "one-way process" where both the positive and negative impacts of globalization work in parallel in society and a process of cross-culture fusion that does not stop with the initial effect of globalization. The discussion involved a reference to the Kesavananda Bharati Case and the Basic Structure of the Constitution.

The panel provided a comprehensive perspective on how constitutional frameworks, particularly the Indian Constitution, are challenged and shaped by global forces. Key themes included the adaptation of the Basic Structure Doctrine in a global context, the growing relevance of International Law and Human Rights, and the need for constitutions to remain "living documents" that can address contemporary issues like climate change, migration, and the complexities of cross-cultural interaction.

Technical Session 3 was nomenclatured ***Justice and Judicial Reform***. The Chair of this session was Prof. Dr. Jasmeet Gulati. The technical session on "***Justice and Judicial Reforms***" featured a series of insightful paper presentations addressing issues of access to justice, judicial efficiency, and constitutional reform.

**1. "Jail Not Bail: Impact of Economic Conditions of Undertrial Prisoners on Pre-Trial Detention,"** Ms. Meghana Mandal, Research Scholar, RTMN University, Nagpur highlighted that 74% of India's prison population comprises undertrial prisoners. She analyzed financial barriers to justice, bail provisions under CrPC, and proposed reforms such as community-based bail alternatives and undertrial review mechanisms, citing Justice V. R. Krishna Iyer's dictum, "*Bail is the rule, jail the exception.*"

**2. A Judiciary of All by a Few: Women's Representation and the Democratic Deficit in the Indian Judiciary.** Mr. Sachin S. Panicker, Faculty, drew attention to the extremely low representation of women in the Indian judiciary.

**3. Justice Without Borders: Constitutional and Policy Perspectives on Regionalizing the Supreme Court.** Ms. Dharshini Sendilkumar, student, RTM, Nagpur University focused on rising case pendency and the adoption of technology-driven solutions like e-courts, SUPACE AI, and online dispute resolution.

**4. Justice and Judicial Reform: Redefining Legal Institutions for a Democratic Society.** Dr. Supriya David, faculty, RTM Nagpur University discussed judicial backlog, vacancies, and the need for reforms such as fast-track courts, the e-courts project, and free legal aid under the Legal Services Authorities Act (1987).

**5. Seventy-Five Years of the Indian Constitution and the Marital Rape Exception: A Constitutional Imperative for Criminal Law Reform,** Mr. Giriraj Singhal and Ms. Shruti Mishra, Research Scholars, Symbiosis Law School, Pune, examined the constitutional conflict arising from the absence of punishment for marital rape under Articles 14, 15, and 21.

**6. Unheard Voices in Justice: Men's Rights During Divorce Settlements.** Ms. Sylvia Rose Antao, Faculty, Fr. Agnel College of Arts and Commerce, Pilar, emphasized that men's concerns are often overlooked in divorce proceedings. She cited NFHS (2015–16) and NCRB (2016) data on violence against men and called for gender-neutral family laws.

**7. Justice and Judicial Reforms.** Ms. Nirmala Velip, LLM Student, MPSLGPP, Goa University," outlined constitutional foundations and challenges such as case pendency, and advocating measures like filling vacancies, modernizing infrastructure, and promoting inclusivity.

In conclusion, the chair offered her reflections on judicial accountability and reform.

Technical Session 4 was titled *Sustainable Development Goals and Constitution*. The session was chaired by **Dr. Seema Fernandes**, Assistant Director, GIPARD, and featured diverse presentations examining the interplay between India's constitutional framework and the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

**1. Medico-Legal Analysis of SDG 3 Targets: Enforcing Access to Medicines and Health System Strengthening through Article 21 in India**

Adv. Sakshi Naik Gaonker, student MPSLGPP, Goa University analyzed SDG 3 (*Good Health and Well-being*) through a medico-legal perspective, highlighting challenges of fiscal federalism and shared responsibility between the Centre and States. Emphasizing the four pillars—availability, accessibility, accountability, and quality—she argued for proactive legal preparedness post-COVID-19 and drew comparative insights from Brazil's "judicialisation" of health and South Africa's Treatment Action Campaign.

**2. Sustainable Development Goals, Women Empowerment, and the Indian Constitution: Reflections, Reforms and the Road Ahead.**

Mr. Harshal Walde, Research Scholar, RTM Nagpur University, Nagpur connected constitutional guarantees under Articles 14, 15, 19, and 42 to SDGs such as No Poverty, Gender Equality, and Quality Education. He stressed the gap between constitutional ideals and lived realities, advocating for substantive rather than symbolic representation of women and stronger institutional accountability.

**3. Realising SDGs Through Maternity Welfare: A Constitutional and Policy Analysis of PMMVY Implementation in Sirmaur District, Himachal Pradesh.**

Ms. Neha Katoch, Research Scholar, Panjab University, Chandigarh examined how maternity welfare schemes, especially the *Pradhan Mantri Matru Vandana Yojana (PMMVY)*, contribute to achieving SDGs by enhancing maternal health, gender equality, and poverty reduction within India's constitutional and policy frameworks.

**4. From Punishment to Protection: Advancing a Romeo-Juliet Clause under POCSO,**

Faculty, DDKSSBS, Goa University proposed re-evaluating the POCSO Act to introduce a "Romeo-Juliet clause" for consensual adolescent relationships (ages 16–18). Drawing on international examples from Canada, South Africa, and Ireland, he suggested Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) to ensure protection-oriented legal responses.

**5. Liberty and Loyalty: The Dual Pillars of Indian Constitutionalism.** Ms. Lakshmi A. R., Student, IILUER, explored the philosophical foundation of the Indian Constitution as a living document balancing rights and duties. Referencing Gandhi's view that "real rights are a result of the performance of duty" and Ambedkar's idea of constitutional morality, she emphasized the role of judicial review and the *Maneka Gandhi v. Union of India* case in safeguarding liberty.

**6. Physical Accessibility and the Constitution: From Tokenism to Transformative Inclusion.** Dr. Suneet Anand and Prof. Ashima Banker, Faculty, Chandigarh University addressed the rights of persons with disabilities under the *Rights of Persons with Disabilities (RPwD) Act, 2016*, advocating for a shift from token compliance to transformative inclusion, ensuring equality and dignity through tangible accessibility measures.

**Panel Discussion 3: The Third Panel Discussion** revolved around the theme *Shaping Governance and Development*. This Panel was chaired by Prof. Rahul Tripathi.

**1. Professor Ashutosh Kumar**, Panjab University, Department of Political Science, joined virtually and reflected on the significance of the Indian Constitution in shaping governance. He described it as both prescriptive *and* regulatory, emphasizing its adaptability and cosmopolitan nature. Citing Article 21 and the *Maneka Gandhi* case, he highlighted the Constitution's enduring strength and its pro-people orientation through Articles 38 and 39. Referring to Amartya Sen, he underscored that economic growth must remain inclusive and people-centric.

**2. Shri Amitabh Ranjan**, Registrar, IIPA, New Delhi, quoted Dr. B. R. Ambedkar, emphasizing the cultivation of constitutional morality. He discussed Sardar Patel's role in ensuring civil service protections and noted the resilience of India's democratic institutions, including the Election Commission and CAG. He lauded Goa's Panchayati Raj model and stressed the importance of skill development among youth. Highlighting fiscal mechanisms like the GST Council and Finance Commission, he noted how the Constitution has strengthened unity and cooperative federalism.

**3. Sr. Prof. Sebastian Morris**, Chair, Centre for Public Policy and Governance, GIM, Goa, offered a critical perspective, citing governance challenges such as poverty, road safety, poor urban planning, and limited administrative accountability. He argued that excessive bureaucratic control and weak institutional autonomy hinder efficiency and innovation, and called for organizational reforms within government.

**4. Ms. Malika Pandey**, Public Policy Professional, Government of India, emphasized that development extends beyond GDP figures. She encouraged youth participation in governance through multiple avenues, stressing that governance should focus on *last-mile delivery* rather than perception management.

**5. Dr. Parag Parobo**, Associate Professor, DDKSSBS, Goa University, discussed the Constitution's focus on citizenship and equality. He provided an overview of Goa's development trajectory, contrasting colonial legacies and highlighting local governance systems, tourism-led growth, and the dominance of family-based politics. He noted that a significant portion of Goa's budget is allocated to government salaries, with recent policies reflecting shifts in land use and development priorities.

## **Technical Session 05: Environment Governance and Forest Rights**

The session on "Environment Governance and Forest Rights" was chaired by Prof. (Dr.) Sairam Bhat. The deliberations explored the intersections between constitutional law, environmental protection, tribal development, and forest governance in India, with comparative and policy perspectives.

**1. Peace, Justice, and Sustainable Development: Gandhian and Mandela Perspectives on Constitutional Governance.** Mr. Xoliswa Mazibuko, Research Scholar, Bangalore University, offered a philosophical reflection on justice, contrasting Gandhi's non-violence and moral politics with Mandela's emphasis on equality and reconciliation, highlighting their shared commitment to constitutional justice.

**2. Democracy and Tribal Development in Madhya Pradesh.** Mr. Anil Kumar, Faculty, Indira Gandhi National Tribal University, Amarkantak examined the constitutional provisions for tribal development in India, focusing on Madhya Pradesh, which has the largest and most diverse tribal population. Despite constitutional guarantees of equality and justice, many tribes—especially in eastern MP—continue to struggle for basic needs like education, health, and livelihood. Economic activities remain largely primitive, and political participation is limited to elections. He explored the effectiveness of existing constitutional measures, reasons for gaps in implementation, and possible reforms to reduce regional disparities and strengthen tribal solidarity as a tool for development.

**3. Indian Constitution: Reflections and Remarks on Forest Rights and Rehabilitation in India.** Mr. Ajit J. Singh, Research Scholar, RTMM Nagpur University presented discussed the constitutional and legislative framework of forest rights under the Forest Act, 2006 and the Rehabilitation Act, 1991. Linking these to Article 21 and Directive Principles such as Article 48-A, he analyzed landmark cases including Ranjeet Singh (1993) and the Buxa Tiger Reserve case.

**4. From Constitutional Ideals to Environmental Stewardship: Policy Evolution from Five-Year Plans to Niti Aayog.** Prof. Ashima Banker and Dr. Suneet Anand (Chandigarh University) jointly presented "from Constitutional Ideals to Environmental Stewardship: Policy Evolution from Five-Year Plans to Niti Aayog." They traced India's policy transition from centralized Five-Year Plans to the decentralized planning approach of Niti Aayog, emphasizing the role of the 74th Constitutional Amendment, renewable energy initiatives, and the importance of citizen participation in environmental policy.

**5. Towards a Greener Tomorrow: Lighting the Path with Solar Energy, Sustainable Development and the Indian Constitution.** Ms. Ria Vaz, Student, MPSLGPP and Dr. Sara Mahima George, Faculty, MPSLGPP, Goa University examined constitutional provisions under Articles 48-A and 51-

A(g), linking them to Sustainable Development Goals, especially those on renewable energy and climate action. The study identified challenges such as high installation costs and low public awareness as barriers to solar adoption.

**6. Rights of Mundkar in Goa: A Dip into the Constitution of India.** Mr. Suhas M. Walawaikar, Research Scholar, V.M. Salgaocar College of Law by focusing on traditional land rights in Goa, examined the evolution of the Right of Mundkar and its connection to Article 21, emphasizing the need for a balanced legislative approach to protect both landowners and tenants.

**7. A Climate-Conscious Constitution** Ms. Vaibhavi Rane, Assistant Professor of Law, Goa University and Ms. Sanskriti Kare Student, MPSLGPP, Goa University called for, integrating climate change considerations into the Constitution, framing it as a question of inter-generational justice. Drawing from global climate data and judicial precedents such as *Mr. Ranjitsinh & Ors vs Union of India* and *Ridhimma Pandey vs UOI (2017)*, they highlighted the judiciary's evolving role in advancing climate accountability and urged comparative analysis toward a climate-resilient constitutional framework.

#### **Technical Session 6: Constitution, Judiciary and Technology.**

The sixth technical session was chaired by Dr. Ajay Gulati, Joint Registrar (Judicial) Delhi High Court.

**1.Reimagining Constitutional Morality in the Digital Republic: Reconciling Liberty, Technology, and Justice in the Next Constitutional Epoch.** Mr. Jayant Singh Raghav, Student, Campus Law Centre, University of Delhi examined the idea of constitutional morality in the digital age, referencing key Supreme Court judgments such as *Puttaswamy v. Union of India (2017)* and *Anuradha Bhasin v. Union of India (2020)*. He highlighted concerns around privacy, internet shutdowns, and digital exclusion, concluding with suggestions for stronger enforcement and accountability mechanisms.

**1.Login to Justice: The Role of Digital Governance in Sustainable Governance.** Ms. Yoga Sree M. and Ms. Shreya S., students, Saveetha School of Law, traced the evolution of digital governance in India through platforms like DigiLocker, UMANG, and RTI portals. Their paper addressed issues of digital inclusion, privacy, and institutional capacity, and concluded with recommendations for transparent and citizen-centric e-governance.

**2.Green or Greenwashed? A Constitutional Assessment of Electric Vehicles as a Sustainable Transportation Solution.** Mr. P. Prem Ebinraj and Ms. B. Ridhu Bala from Saveetha School of Law, explored the constitutional and environmental dimensions of electric vehicle adoption in India. They emphasized that sustainability must encompass the entire lifecycle of technology—from production to waste management.

**3.Constitution and Technology** Mr.Pravash Dayanand Raikar, practicing advocate and student at Goa Business School, Goa University, discussed

constitutional questions arising from digital surveillance, GPS tracking, and data scraping, and reflected on gaps in India's legal framework regarding cybersecurity, data privacy, and artificial intelligence.

**4.A Techno-Constitutional Analysis of India's Digital Public Infrastructure.** Mr. Akash Namdeo Naik, examined the growth of India's digital infrastructure, including Aadhaar and UPI, as pillars of governance. He analyzed both the empowerment potential and risks of centralized data systems, noting that artificial intelligence represents the next frontier in digital governance.

#### **Technical Session 07: Federalism and Governance**

The seventh Technical Session was chaired by **Prof. Seema Salgaonkar**, Professor of Political Science, Government College, Khandola. The session featured insightful presentations examining India's federal system and the challenges it faces in governance and coordination.

**1.Bridging the Gap: Federalism and Governance in India's Disaster Management.** Mr. Rohit Rabindra Paul RTMN University, Nagpur analyzed disaster management mechanisms under the 2004 Act, identifying challenges such as overlapping roles, unequal state capacities, weak local governance, and financial dependence on the Centre. He proposed greater use of technology—AI and GPS—and improved coordination to strengthen disaster resilience.

**2.Green Federalism 2.0: Rethinking India's Environmental Governance Architecture.** Dr. Utkarsh Mishra and Ms. Kausambi Singh Tomar, University of Lucknow emphasized citizens' participation, intergovernmental cooperation, and the importance of a strong federal structure in achieving sustainable environmental governance.

**3.Indian Federalism at 75: Dynamics and Challenges in Centre-State Relationship.** Mr. Nanda Ray Bhatt, Banaras Hindu University presented "*Indian Federalism at 75: Dynamics and Challenges in Centre-State Relationship*." He examined coordination issues between the Centre, States, and local bodies, highlighting the need to reinforce cooperative federalism to ensure effective governance and crisis management.

**4. 75 Years of Federal Governance: Diversifying the Role and Future of All India Services.** Mr. Utkarsh Agarwal, Research Scholar University of Delhi addressed the *generalist versus specialist* debate in India's administration. Drawing examples from the health sector, he discussed disparities in service delivery and the shortage of doctors in remote regions, suggesting improved coordination and dialogue to enhance public sector efficiency.

**5. Rethinking the Federal Governance of Religious Diversity in the 21st Century** Mr. Pramahaha Yankhup Khetsiriworakun, Bangalore University

presented reflected on how India's federal structure could be strengthened to manage religious and cultural diversity, advocating for inclusive policymaking and dialogue to promote social harmony.

**6.Reinventing India's Public Institutions: Safeguarding Constitutional Resilience and Institutional Integrity toward India @2047.** " Dr. Sandeep Inampudi, Faculty, Central University of Karnataka emphasized the significance of strengthening public institutions to uphold democracy, rebuild trust, enhance transparency, and preserve constitutional values for a resilient India by 2047.

**7.Understanding Federal Asymmetries: Governance and Regional Disparities in India.** Dr. Rounak Kumar Pathak, Delhi University examined how variations in governance capacity, resources, and development across states contribute to regional inequalities. He advocated for stronger fiscal policies, decentralization, and equitable resource distribution to promote balanced development and cooperative governance.

In her closing remarks Prof. Seema Salgaonkar, mphasized the importance of Centre-State coordination, technological innovation, and citizen participation in achieving cooperative federalism and effective governance.

#### **Technical Session 08: Rights and Directive Principles of State Policy**

The eighth technical session was moderated by Prof. Debasis Patnaik, The session featured insightful presentations exploring the interconnections between constitutional rights, Directive Principles, and sustainable development goals (SDGs).

**1.Constitutional Provisions for Persons with Disabilities in India.** Ms. Jyoti Singh, Faculty, Indira Gandhi National Tribal University, Amarkantak, MP highlighted the constitutional and legal safeguards ensuring equality and inclusion for persons with disabilities, emphasizing the need for stronger policy implementation and social awareness.

**2. Appreciating the Nexus between DPSPs and SDGs for Environmental Sustainability in India.** Dr. Aditi Rane, Faculty, PES's R.S.N. College, Farmagudi citing Articles 48-A and 51-A(g) alongside SDG 15, discussed India's environmental policies and initiatives such as the Environment (Protection) Act and community-based forest management. She emphasized the complementarity between Article 48-A and SDG 15.2.1, underscoring the importance of local leadership and sustainable forest governance.

**3.Realizing SDGs through the Constitutional Lens: A Study of DPSPs as Enablers of Sustainable Development** Dr. Utkarsh Mishra, Faculty, Amity University, Uttar Pradesh identified a research gap in understanding DPSPs as non-justiciable yet transformative instruments for SDG implementation. Drawing on four theoretical frameworks—Transformative Constitution, Sustainable Ethics, Convergence Theory, and Policy Integration—he

analyzed policy case studies such as MGNREGA (2005) in connection with Article 41 and SDGs 1 and 8. He proposed strategic recommendations for purposive integration and policy harmonization while noting the limited coverage of SDGs 8, 9, and 11 within DPSPs.

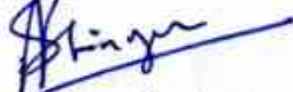
**4. Constitutional Safeguards to the Right to Information.** Mr. Aarvind Kumar H. Nair, Research Scholar, V.M. Salgaocar College of Law underscored that democracy thrives on informed citizenry and transparency, linking Article 19 to the Right to Information as an essential facet of free speech and expression. Comparative insights from other constitutional democracies were also discussed.

**5. Realizing the Right to Work: A Data-Driven Evaluation of Goa's CMRY and Its Constitutional Relevance to Employment Generation.** Ms. Cherrie Fatima Joao, Faculty, Sant Sohirobanath Ambiye Govt. College and Research Centre, Pernem examined the impact of the Chief Minister's Rojgar Yojana (CMRY) on employment in Goa, revealing a positive correlation between fund utilization and job creation.

The Chief Guest for the Valedictory Function of the Conference Shri Amitabh Ranjan, Registrar, Indian Institute of Public Administration (IIPA), New Delhi. The valedictory function was graced by the presence of Prof. Sundar Dhuri, Registrar of Goa University, Sr. Prof. Rajendra S. Gad and the Coordinator of the National Conference, Dr. Alaknanda Shringare.
