The objectives of the Program/activity/event	- Introduce principles of critical text editing - Analyse Ramayana manuscript variants - Comparative analysis of major recensions (Lahore edition, Goresio edition, Baroda edition) - Map parallel verses across recensions - Reconstruct passages using Samarth Ramadasa's recension

Description of the Program/activity/event	The School of Sanskrit, Philosophy and Indic Studies, Goa University, in association with Shri Samarth Vagdevata Mandir –Dhule Maharashtra, organized a one-day workshop on Critical Text Editing of Valmiki Ramayana Using Manuscript of Samarth Ramadasa Svami on 20th March 2026, at Seminar Hall, Block B and classroom BF-30 Block B, Goa University. The workshop saw the participation of 30 individuals, including not only students and faculty members of the university but also enthusiasts and professionals from diverse fields beyond academia,

reflecting the wide-ranging interest in the Manuscriptology as well as Ramayana.

Prof. Sanjyot Pai Vernekar, Dean of the School of Sanskrit, Philosophy and Indic Studies (SSPIS), Goa University, addressed everyone and extended a warm welcome. Rushikesh Dongre, a 2nd year student compared the inaugural event. Miss Mrunal Deshpande and Miss Shrusha Nagvekar, both 1st year students sung prayer at the beginning of the event. The programme was coordinated by Dattanubhav Tengse, Assistant Professor and Co-coordinated by Dr. Yogita Kelkar Assistant Professor and Programme Director at SSPIS, who played a key role in organizing the event. Participants had the opportunity to learn from two accomplished instructors. Dr. Nilesh Joshi, a renowned Linguist and Scientist from IIT Bombay, served as the workshop resource person. He was joined by Shri Sharad Kuber Ramdasi, President(former) and Ramadas Svami Literature Researcher through Google Meet. Their collective ability enriched the workshop.

The first session began with an introduction to the Samarth Vagdevata Mandir and resource person Shri Sharad Kuber shared his work experience towards finding the original copy of manuscript. Next 3 sessions were Hands-on sessions conducted by Dr. Nilesh Joshi in which participants were first shown how to transcribe a sample passage

from Ramdas Svami's manuscript. Next session was on comparative analysis of major recensions namely Lahore edition, Goresio edition, Nirnay Sagar Bombay edition, Baroda edition. Participants discussed on textual variations in these editions with prompt examples.

Next session highlighted on concordance development in which participants were introduced with the technique of mapping parallel verses across recensions.

Last session was about study of colophon analysis and collection where every participant recorded script, script details, dates, and other minute details.

Dr. Nilesh Joshi provided workshop material for all participants.

The workshop concluded with a valedictory function, graced by Shri Tanmay Pradeep Hardikar Vyakarana Adhyapak of Shrividya Pathshala Rivona Goa, invited as the Chief Guest. In his brief address, he appreciated the efforts of the Discipline of Sanskrit and commended it for the dedication shown in organising such an insightful and enriching workshop. He further added that linguistic refinement plays a significant role in decoding any manuscript. He showed many examples like "भरद्वाज" & "भारद्वाज" can sound similar but have significant meanings. He believed that initiatives like these provide much-needed exposure and learning opportunities for them and should be encouraged. Sumedha Thakur, 2nd year student expressed her experience in brief. Participation certificates were

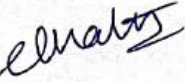

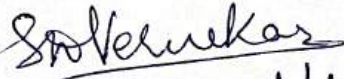
