To examine the legal framework governing waste management in India, with particular reference to constitutional provisions, environmental statutes, rules, and judicial interventions. 2. To analyse national and state waste management policies and assess their effectiveness in addressing contemporary environmental and public health challenges. 3. To promote an integrated understanding of waste management, combining legal, administrative, technological, and community-based approaches. 4. To create awareness about the principles of sustainable development, circular economy, and extended producer responsibility (EPR) in the context of waste management. 5. To study best practices and practical models of waste management, including solid, plastic, biomedical, e-waste, and hazardous waste management. 6. To highlight the role of local self-governments, regulatory authorities, and enforcement agencies in implementation and compliance with waste management laws. 7. To discuss the challenges in enforcement of waste management laws and explore legal and policy-oriented solutions for effective compliance. 8. To encourage stakeholder participation, including citizens, industries, educational institutions, and civil society, in achieving effective waste segregation, recycling, and disposal. 9. To sensitise participants to environmental justice and public accountability, emphasizing the rights and duties of citizens in maintaining a clean and healthy environment. 10. To foster capacity building among students, professionals, and administrators by bridging the gap between legal theory, policy formulation, and practical implementation.

Description of the Program/activity/event	The workshop titled “Integrated Approaches to Waste Management: Perspectives on Law, Policy and Practice” is designed to provide a comprehensive understanding of waste management as a multidisciplinary and legally regulated activity. The programme focuses on the growing challenges posed by improper waste generation, segregation, treatment, and disposal, and emphasizes the need for integrated solutions that combine legal frameworks, policy instruments, administrative mechanisms, and practical implementation strategies. The programme also examines national and state-level policies, rules, and guidelines, highlighting their objectives, enforcement mechanisms, and compliance requirements. The event bridges the gap between law and practice by discussing real-world challenges in waste management, including urbanization, public participation, institutional coordination, technological constraints, and accountability of stakeholders. It highlights the roles of government authorities, local bodies, industries, institutions, and citizens in achieving effective and sustainable waste management systems. Overall, workshop aims to promote legal awareness, policy understanding, and practical insights, encouraging participants to adopt environmentally responsible practices and contribute meaningfully to sustainable development and environmental governance.
